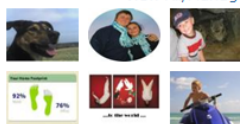

Sharepoint 2010 - what do we get?  
April 19, 2010

I have been waiting for my demo of SP2010 to better understand what exactly will change in the next release and how we can plan on the D Street team. My thought is that eventually SP2010 will replace the 2.0 version of D Street and DeloitteNet. With the official unveiling at the conference this week, the three biggies from my perspective are:

- **Enhanced social networking features** - A D Street-like experience out of the box
- **Improved search** - The addition of FAST to SharePoint gives a much improved search experience.
- **Aggregation features** - Most everything that Newsgator does now, SP2010 will do. The only missing part (and it is a big one) is JOIN and LEAVE.

Other improvements are also significant. For instance, the UI Improvements:

- **Multi-Browser Support** - will support multiple browsers such as Safari and Firefox
- **New Ribbon Feature** - the same one we see in office will now be a part of Sharepoint.
- **Real Dialog Boxes** - 2010 will use real dialog boxes, instead of redirects to another web page with your dialog box options. Much more in tune with the way web applications work today.
- **Live Preview & Themes** - The ability to set a theme for your look and feel within SharePoint is improved. Included is the ability to take your PowerPoint theme and upload and apply it to your SharePoint site.
- **Silverlight** - comes with 2010 out of the box. No more flash (yea!!)

Lastly, SP2010 will really empower the business with the following enhancements:

- **Visio Integration** - With 2010, you can publish visio diagrams directly to SharePoint with the back end connection remaining intact. So the view of the diagram is real time.
- **Improved SharePoint Designer** - with new modeling capabilities and enhanced workflow.
- **Improved Business Connectivity Services** - enabling you to connect Line of Business applications, web services and databases to SharePoint easily using the new SharePoint Designer, as well as Visual Studio 2010.
- **Offline options with SharePoint Workspace** - With 2010 you can take your SharePoint content offline with the SharePoint Workspace (formerly Groove)

Now all we need to do is get a project onboarded for the migration in FY2011....

July 21, 2009

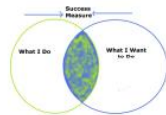

Collaboration at Deloitte  
April 29, 2009

Currently, a team of Deloitte professionals is working to converge the internal portal with the D Street environment. The new DeloitteNet Home Page will reside on the SharePoint 2007 platform that currently hosts D Street. Practitioners will experience a much more customized user experience when visiting DeloitteNet as the portal will be tailored to each practitioner's role, level, industry, function and geography. In addition, the combined DeloitteNet and D Street product will extend the flow of information to the users and communities that consume it. The DeloitteNet Home Page will direct practitioners to key firm systems, connect people to communities, provide a repository for news and information, and will be the single source for all employees to gather information. So what does that mean for a content owner in Talent?

1. A collaborative portal will create many more opportunities for user-generated content. Collaboration managers should begin to formulate how to funnel those thoughts into structured wikis, blogs, discussion boards and other collaborative web parts.
2. We will now have the ability to aggregate activity from community sites and colleagues. This will simplify the process of finding, following, and exploring content located in multiple locations and written by many authors. For content managers, this means that your role will become a gardener of sorts, responsible for planting seeds for knowledge and information to grow.
3. An integrated portal supported by a social networking system will make innovation at Deloitte a business discipline. The world is changing rapidly. Economists, historians, and politicians are all saying that we are experiencing times like no other. Innovation will be a key component as we emerge into our new world once the economy rebounds. This is the ideal place to host innovation.

So what should content owners be doing to prepare for this organizational and cultural shift?

- Learn about how Deloitte is moving to a community structure and start now to identify potential communities within your areas that might benefit from a community page.
- Begin to experiment with the technology. Use the D Street community wizard to see how communities can be built on D Street.
- Write and talk about the changes that are occurring. Educate the people you represent.
- Read what you can about Web 2.0.
